#### THE 1986 RECRUITMENT CAMPAIGN

For several years the number of CAMRA members was falling slightly, mainly because people were not renewing their membership. However, at the end of 1983 things started to level out slightly and at the present time the figures are showing encouraging growth.

Unfortunately CAMRA made a loss last year and to try and offset this, the annual subscription has risen to £9.00, the first increase for FIVE years. This is not extortionate, considering the rate of inflation over that time. On top of this, couples can have joint membership for only £9.00 and 0.A.P's only have to pay £6.00. Life Membership is also available for £90 and is proving very popular. In the year to last Christmas the figures rose by over 400%.

Because of subscription rises, a recruitment campaign is


most important. We don't want the upturn in membership halted. Remember CAMRA is the ONLY body who represents the pub goer in general, and tries to protect him/her from the big powerful anti-consumer minded breweries who are concerned only with their profit at the expense of others. We oppose takeovers, price rises, monopolies, restrictive opening hours, the tied house system, poorly kept real ale, insensitive modernisation of traditional pubs, short measure etc. as well as processed keg beers.

As part of the membership

drive, special deals are often available at CAMRA events. At our CARNIVAL STALL people who join will be given bar towels. badges, beer mats etc. At beer festivals free beer, guides or refunded admissions is not unusual. This would be a good time to join. Often you can get a lot of your money back with such deals if your're worried about the cost. Remember you are able to buy the GOOD BEER GUIDE cheaper than nonmembers and get into beer festivals free. Members are also entitled to vote for their favourite pubs for G B G inclusion, attend local social events, go on brewery visits (usually free admission and beer!) On top of all that you would get a monthly edition of our newspaper "WHAT'S BREWING" through your door, meet many new friends who would have similar interest and be part of a worthwhile consumer group who are protecting a unique product that is part of Britain's heritage. A few battles have been won but we are losing the war, especially with so many independents being lost and lager taking a bigger share of the market. People who think CAMRA has won are acting like the proverbial ostrich with his head in the sand.

#### THE REGENCY

Wolverhampton & Dudley Breweries continue expanding with the opening of The Regency on Stratford Road, just south of Shirley. It is due to be a large hotel in time but much work remains to be done regarding this. However, a large plush lounge called The Pavilion is open and it sells traditional Banks's Mild & Bitter, plus Hansons Black Country Bitter (which is brewed by Banks's). On my only visit the beer was in reasonable condition and this is the only pub in the area that sells Banks's beers.

#### PUB PRESERVATION

Pub preservation is on a pretty even keel at the present time. the brewers seem to be making a concerted effort to preserve the basic fabric of pubs when they are renovated using genuine crafted materials rather than putting their efforts into the "theme" designs we encountered during the 1960's and 70's. Locally, Ansells cam be congratulated on its tasteful refurbishments and M. & B. too must be pleased with their efforts at the Masons Arms. However. there is a dark side to all of this, probably due to the close proximity of the NEC. We have seen a spate of pub conversions into "Carvery restaurants" such as the Wilsons Arms in Knowle and the Nags Head in Hockley Heath. Thankfully the "fun pub" idea seems to be dying a slow death, Toad Hall in Hall Green has reverted back to the Horse Shoes. Ansells have seen the error of their ways. Unfortunately, this hasn't helped the vandalised. derelict George & Dragon on the A34 in Shirley. It was to be converted into a "fun pub" but financial problems have made its future uncertain. Along with the Royal Oak in Hockley Heath, which is being turned into a Greek "Taverna", the George & Dragon has been added to the CAMRA "Lost Locals List" of closed and demolished pubs. Local authorities can also be responsible for the demise of pubs in Birmingham. I have seen the demolition in recent months of the General Wolfe in Gosta Green. This is due to the gradual strangulation of the area by the Aston Science Park. Two other locals were also threatened. The popular Prince of Wales in Cambridge Street, famed for its Ansells Mild, is overshadowed by the £106m Broad Street Convention Centre. The Council doesn't seem to realise that these facilities are engrained into the local fabric and should be retained at all costs.

THE NATIONAL BREWER MUSEUM TRUST

The Trust was formed about a year ago to try and preserve the old Everards Brewery in Burton Upon Trent. Everards wanted to close the brewery and move all operations to Leicester, where they have been based for some years. The Tiger Brewery, although rather run down, is a classic example of the Victoria tower brewery design and it would have been catastrophic if the building had been demolished. A new company called Heritage Brewery Ltd., has been formed and they brew Mild and Tiger Bitter for Everards. (As a point of interest, Old Original

is brewed at a small new plant in Leicester and Beacon has been replaced by a new inferior Bitter which is brewed by Whitbread. The Trust are renovating the whole site and plan to turn it into a WORKING museum. It is hoped that many brewing related exhibits will ultimiately be on display, such as working machinery, all kinds of memorabilia and brewery advertising material. Until this innovative museum was planned, there was no National Centre in the country for housing "the existing material and artifacts" relating to the brewing industry. This has now been put right! What makes a visit to the museum so appetising is the fact that it still brews beer in the traditional manner. You will be able to go on organised

#### WHO'S FOR A LOUNGE IN THE BAR

Has your local pub still got a public bar these days? This institution is now under threat in some areas where several rooms are knocked through into a lounge room and with only one bar to staff, they charge higher prices; economical sense to brewery accountants.

So what is the loss involved with a public bar.... darts - some dartboards do find their way into obsure corners of dimly lit lounges - dominoes - too noisy!... pensioners don't spend enough money - drinks last too long... workmen in overalls - banned from dirtying chairs and carpets with greasy clothes and shoes.....

Most sports teams - crib, football etc. Added together all the old characters and bar regulars -

the backbone of most pubs' trade that make up a unique ATMOSPHERE. That has been destroyed! Of over 70 pubs in the Solihull CAMRA area only 29 retain a Public Bar: Recent losses were M & B's Red Lion, Earlswood and Hampton in Arden s Engine. Others now have fancy names decorating them, becoming open plan areas and we the public have to pay the extra cost of the beer for the privilege of having no choice in which room we drink in - usually a pricey lounge bar often directed towards diners with little atmosphere and overbearing food smells. Evidence of this erosion of choice is the fact that only ONE pub in each of these towns has a public bar amongst their choice of pubs..... Solihull, Henley in Arden and to a lesser extent. Knowle. Think about it and find them out sometime!
